WASTEWATER

The main plant located in the City of Portsmouth treated 123.000 million gallons in August 2014 with an average daily flow of 3.97 MGD. The Sciotoville plant treated 6.928 million gallons for the month of August 2014 for an average daily flow of 0.223 MGD. Maximum rainfall at the Portsmouth plant was 1.35 inches on August 11, 2014. The Maximum rainfall recorded at the Sciotoville Plant was 1.23 inches on August 2, 2014.
